Lot 318 Donations

The Lodge recently used funds donated by members to purchase ninety backpacks. Each one included school supplies and dictionaries (from the Lodge Dictionary Program). The backpacks were donated to Lot 318's Homework Club. These backpacks were given to elementary, junior and high school students who participate in this program.

The Homework Club is designed to assist disadvantaged children at two community sites in Placentia, California. Homework Club Helpers tutor students for two hours, after their normal school day. Each day, Homework Club Helpers help set up tables, chairs, and supplies necessary for the students to work together. The Homework Club directly supports students right in their neighborhood, helping them to succeed in school. This includes having a fully stocked classroom with a library, math tools, STEM kits, and more! Students are guided in math, reading, research, and critical thinking, sparking their excitement for learning.

Lot 318 exists to walk alongside at-risk youth and their community by empowering them to see their worth and purpose in this world. This is accomplished by holding various events and offering service opportunities, which opens students' eyes to the world around them. These young people are challenged to serve others in the community and make a difference amongst their peers. Lot 318 believes in the importance of education, teaching self-value, and informing young people of resources they have available to them.

The Lodge also provided study supplies and aids to help encourage the children to read daily and successfully complete homework assignments in a positive environment. Volunteers who helped in the distribution of the backpacks were Karen Seeley, Marie Nunez, Trudy Nuzum and Joseph Petri.
